Subcamp 3 is proud to offer geocaching (sponsored by DeLorme) as a Subcamp activity for the 2010 National Jamboree, Geocaching participants use a GPS device to locate

markers and/or a hidden cache from coordinates that are provided—similar to orienteering with a map and compass.

It takes approximately 30 minutes to complete Subcamp 3's geocache course. It is recommended that no less than two scouts—preferably four scouts—work as a team.

To receive a GPS unit to use for this activity, an adult must exchange his or her driver's license at the program tent.

Other activity offerings from the program tent include volleyball, frisbee, Wiffle ball and football. Activities can be run any time the Program Staff is available.
