## Arena Show Mobilization

The opening arena show begins today at 9:00 AM. Pick up breakfast at 6:00 and make sure you eat before you go. Line up on the road between the staff tents and the maintenance area and we'll start walking to the arena at 7:30 AM.

### Make plans for after the show

Scoutmasters need to know where their Scouts are going after the show. Are they coming back to camp to change? Are they staying to go to merit badge midway or the national exhibits (both closer to the arena than the subcamp)?

### Stay safe

Watch for emergency vehicles while en route, or anytime you're on the roads.

Even though it's fairly cool in the morning, still drink plenty of water so you don't get dehydrated. There will be water at the arena to refill your water bottles so you have enough for the show and the walk back to camp afterwards.

### Unacceptable items

Folding chairs  
Big backpacks  
Laser pointers  
Flip-flops or open toe shoes  
Flags

If you bring an unacceptable item, it will be taken from you at the arena entrance. You'll have to go the national lost and found at Heth to try to retrieve it (there are no guarantees you'll get it back).

## Chaplain's Corner

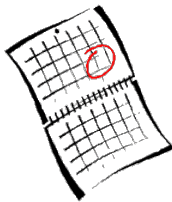

## Stuff You Need To Know

**Cell phones** MUST be charged at the AT&T kiosks. The Army is confiscating phones found charging at other subcamp locations. If your cell phone is confiscated, it can be picked up at the headquarters tent.

The Registrar needs your **tent assignments**. If you haven't turned them in yet, they're overdue.

**Taps** are at 10:15 every night; scouts must be in the subcamp by then. By 10:45, scoutmasters need to report in to the headquarters tent.

The **Post Officer** reminds troops that only an adult may pick up mail. Mail will not be given to Scouts.

## Patrol Flag Contest

The Boys' Life Patrol Flag Contest recognizes patrols that have gone above and beyond and created an outstanding patrol flag.

### Judging Criteria

Flags will be judged on originality, identity and workmanship. A full scoring list is available in the Troop section of the subcamp website.

### Troop Judging – Wed, July 28

Youth and adult leaders of each troop should select the winning entry from their troop today

### Subcamp Judging – Thu, July 29

Winning flags from each troop must be delivered to the subcamp headquarters by 10 AM on Thursday, July 29. The chaplains will select three winning flags from the subcamp. Each winning patrol will be presented a ribbon for the flag and each patrol member will receive a patch. Also, each patrol will receive a temporary patrol flag to carry while its flag is being judged at the region level.

### Region Judging – Fri, July 30

The three winning subcamp flags will be delivered to the Northeast Region

headquarters by 10 AM on Friday, July 30. Three flags will be chosen during the region competition. Each winning patrol will receive a ribbon for the flag and each patrol member will receive a patch.

### Boys' Life Exhibit – Sat, July 31

All winning patrols from each region will present their flags at the boys' life exhibit area at 9:30 am on Saturday, July 31. Official photographs will be taken of each winning patrol and its flag, followed by a brief recognition ceremony.
