International Friendship Day a Success!

Yesterday was International Friendship Day at the 2010 Jamboree. Scouts from around the world came together in a series of special events, including a Good Turn opportunity for scouts to donate to the World Friendship Fund, used to promote Scouting around the world.

Northeast Region Subcamps are sponsoring international scout groups from Brazil, El Salvador, Trinidad and Tobago,



Malaysia, Indonesia, Canada, Honduras and Germany. More than 50 Scouts from these countries are embedded with U.S.-based troops in Subcamps 1, 2 and 4. Scouts have the pleasure of listening to the Steel Drum Band formed by Scouts from Trinidad and Tobago Today at 5:00 PM, at the Northeast Region stage.

Nearly 400 international scouts from 29 countries are sharing in the Jamboree experience. As new program this year, regions sponsor college-aged "ambassador" staff members who supports each international contingent.

John Pyfer, Northeast Region's International Commissioner, said that the international program sells itself. "Once a troop sponsors an international contingent, the experience is so good that they always request an assignment for subsequent Jamborees."

Mr. Pyfer also highlighted the region's international exchange program, where a patrol from the U.S. spends two weeks in a foreign country for a Camporee or summer camp. A patrol from the host country then comes to the U.S. for a similar experience. The World Jamboree will be held in Sweden next year and is an excellent opportunity to meet scouts from other countries.



The U.S. is petitioning to host the first ever "North American" World Jamboree in 2019, co-hosting with Canada and Mexico at the BSA's new Bechtel Summit in West Virginia. The final decision will be made at the World Scout Conference in January.

What do I do in severe weather?

If we experience severe weather at the Jamboree, you'll hear a public address message giving you weather information or directions. This information will be repeated on QBSA, 102.9 FM. If no instructions are given, follow these guidelines:

- Secure all troop site areas
- Go to the nearest area where your troop leaders or staff will assist you
- Find cover out of the weather in tents or buildings
- Stay in the shelter until the weather passes
- Do not take shelter beneath trees, power lines, or antennas
- If you are sheltering in a tent with aluminum poles or metal cots, keep as far away from them as possible, and don't touch them
