
Don't Bring

Medical Note: Treating minor issues Every Scout here learned first aid to

Every Scout here learned first aid to earn First Class, the minimum rank required to attend the Jamboree.

The medical staff encourages you to put those skills to use and treat minor issues in your site with your personal or troop first aid kit instead of coming to the medical tent.

You should feel comfortable treating these on your own:

- Minor scrapes and cuts—clean and bandage
- Bee stings—if no visible reaction, clean sting and put on a band aid

- If there's a rash or you have trouble breathing, come to the medical tent immediately
- If it later gets red, stop by during sick call
- Blisters–cut moleskin to cover the area.
 - Prevent blisters by cleaning your feet daily, wearing clean socks and not wearing flip flops or wet shoes to walk long distances.

Of course, we'll see anyone who comes to us, but we want you to be out exploring the Jamboree, not at the medical tent.

Merit Badge Midway

How many merit badges does the Boy Scouts of America offer? You can find out with a visit to the Merit Badge Midway.

You'll be able to learn about any merit badge that interests you and may find some that you didn't even know existed.

You can complete some, if not all, of the requirements and you don't need a blue card. Just make sure that you have your Jamboree ID; the requirements you complete will be sent to your council electronically.
